**Rose Seidler House** was built between 1948 and 1950 by celebrated architect Harry Seidler, in the uncompromising modern style he was famous for. Nestled in the natural bushland of Wahroonga, the house features spectacular views of Ku-ring-gai National Park from its expansive deck.



Glass walls allow natural sunlight to fill the venue, highlighting the bold colours and open planning that earned Seidler the Sulman Medal for his creation.



The **Living and Dining Room** seats 12 guests for an intimate dinner or corporate seminar, and pre-dinner drinks and canapés can be served on the deck, overlooking the National Park.



The **Gardens and Grounds** are suitable for cocktail receptions for up to 200 guests. Featuring unusual rockery and exotic plants, the gardens are surrounded by the serenity of the National Park. The house makes an arresting backdrop, a unique touch for your next private or corporate event with a difference.
