

Hyde Park Barracks

Sydney



Located on Macquarie Street in the heart of Sydney, just north of Hyde Park, **Hyde Park Barracks** was designed by the convict architect Francis Greenway and built using convict labour between 1817 and 1819.

Used until 1848 to provide housing for Sydney's convict labourers, the Barracks have since been used as an Immigration Depot for single women, a women's asylum, and government offices.

Since 1979 the site has been historically restored and is now used as a museum demonstrating Hyde Park Barrack's role in Australia's convict and immigrant history.

A high sandstone wall surrounding the Barracks creates a courtyard ideal for large events. Entry to the site is through large iron gates flanked by colonial gatehouses, creating a unique colonial atmosphere for your next event.

The **Southern Courtyard** is suitable for marquee events, seating up to 350 guests for banquet dinners and up to 500 guests for cocktails. The courtyard is located adjacent to the Barracks building and is the ideal venue for outdoor or themed cocktail receptions, gala dinners, award presentations and product launches.

Hyde Park Barracks Museum is in walking distance from public transport and close to major parking stations, making it readily accessible for all your guests.
