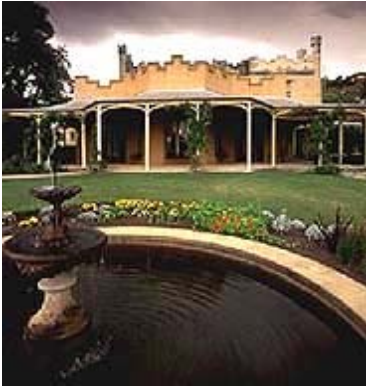


Vaucluse House

Vaucluse House, built in 1803, is located in the eastern suburbs and is one of Sydney's most treasured estates. The house is surrounded by 10 hectares of picturesque gardens and grounds stretching down to Sydney Harbour. The sandstone mansion was built in the 1830's and was the home of William Charles Wentworth, father of the Australian Constitution, and his family. The estate is a peaceful oasis away from the hectic city bustle.

Within the house, the **Little Drawing Room** is ideal for intimate dinners seating up to 20 guests or 35 guests for cocktail parties. The Little Drawing Room opens out onto the sandstone verandah where guests can enjoy pre-dinner drinks and canapés looking out over the magnificent fountain and gardens.



The **Lone Pine Lawn** is situated adjacent to the Pleasure Garden and lends itself to weddings and larger events. The backdrop of the house and the gardens make a perfect setting for wedding ceremonies, photographs and cocktail receptions.

Vaucluse House provides parking for guests and is easily accessible by bus. The venue is ideal for wedding ceremonies and receptions, intimate and gala events, cocktail parties, sit down lunches or casual breakfast or brunch events.
